



## **PUBLIC NOTICE – COVID-19**

### ***COURT AND TRIBUNAL WORKER (RESTRICTIONS ON ACCESS) DIRECTIONS***

This notice applies to the Supreme Court of Western Australia's premises at the David Malcolm Justice Centre and Stirling Gardens in Perth.

Pursuant to paragraph 9 of the *Court and Tribunal Worker (Restrictions on Access) Directions (Directions)*, I have required that all persons who enter either site are to provide evidence of their vaccination status for inspection. In accordance with that requirement, all persons attending the Court's premises must produce evidence of their vaccination status to security upon arrival.

Any person who does **not** produce evidence of the vaccination requirements or exemptions in the *Directions* will be asked to complete the attached form. If such a person is a 'court or tribunal worker' as defined in the *Directions*, in accordance with those *Directions*, they may not enter the Court premises. Persons who are not 'court or tribunal workers' as defined in the *Directions*, will be permitted to enter the premises and will be asked to provide the completed form to the associate to the presiding judicial officer. It is a matter for the presiding judicial officer whether any additional steps are required during the course of proceedings.

Legal practitioners who are aware that clients and witnesses are not vaccinated are encouraged to provide the form to those persons in advance of attendance to facilitate an orderly process upon entry. Where possible the presiding judicial officer should also be so advised in advance.

All persons attending the Supreme Court must comply with the *COVID Transition (Face Covering) Directions* at all times.
